What is a Bequest?

A bequest is a formal instruction in your Will to leave a gift to a specific person, organization or charity. The gift could be in the form of money, property or other assets. Blue Light recommends that you seek legal advice when preparing your Will and discuss the instructions you are making in your Will with your family or close relatives.

What are the types of Bequests?

There are three types of bequests you can make in support of Blue Light. They include:

- A set amount of money or a pecuniary bequest.
- The residue or a percentage of the residue of your estate once other bequests have been made. This is known as a residuary bequest.
- A specific asset, which could be property, art works or shares.

Changing or Updating your Will?

Making a change or updating your Will is neither difficult nor expensive.

If you already have a Will, you can easily add Blue Light Victoria through a legal amendment to your existing Will. This is known as a codicil.

It is important to seek legal advice when making a change to your Will.
