The year started with our facilitator training day held at the Victorian Police Centre in Melbourne. The day focussed on trialling new activities such as 'What are our strengths' where the participants are taken through numerous stations that show that not all strengths are physical. Participants also completed activities examining stereotypes and 'Stress balloons' a visual representation of how asking for help can lessen stress.

We're excited to see these activities in action and look forward to hearing the positive stories that the term brings!

Blue EDGE Jenga

Blue EDGE Jenga is the backup activity for any session where the facilitator is sick or the group size is reduced due to a school camp or excursion. Similar to the normal game, Blue EDGE Jenga has a twist. Each brick has a question or task on it that the participants must complete when they pull the bricks out. These include: What would you do with a million dollars?, Dance with no music for 30 seconds and Do 10 burpees without the Jenga tower falling over!

Flip the Tarp!

Session 4 of Blue EDGE centres around collaboration and teamwork. Ensuring the groups have a strong foundation of communication and trust is vital prior to discussing deeper topics such as diversity and mental health later in the program.

Flip the tarp is a fun activity where groups of 5-6 people stand on a small tarp which they need to flip over without stepping off! The groups need to work together to figure how best to complete the task, ensuring they communicate well and work as a team.

The students loved this activity! It was great to see them working as a team and everybody was so excited when they worked out the solution!
